#### **Review of the year:**

We have hosted two major seminars in the last 12 months. The next event is planned for April 2016. All events have been held at De Montfort University.

On Monday 11<sup>th</sup> May, 2015, Prof. Joanna Latimer, Cardiff University, gave the keynote talk on 'Repelling neoliberal world-making: ageing, dementia and iresponse-ability'. There were additional presentations by Oliver Williams, University of Leicester 'Health Inequalities, New Public Health and Area-Based Initiatives: Redressing Ecological Disparities or Placing Blame?' and Caroline Morris, University of Leicester 'The Practice of Cardiovascular Risk Assessment in Primary Care'. Thirty-five people attended the event. The cost of this event ranged between being free (Student BSA Members), £5 (BSA Members and Non BSA Students) and £10 (Non BSA Members). A light lunch was provided.

On Wednesday 16<sup>th</sup> December 2015, Prof Simon Dyson, Director of the Unit for the Social Study of Thalassaemia and Sickle Cell, De Montfort University, delivered a talk "Talk to me. There's two of us" Fathers and sickle cell screening'. Twenty-six people attended the event. Delegates were a mixture of students, university and NHS researchers and clinicians from across the Midlands. The event was free to attend and refreshments were provided.
