BSA Race and Ethnicity Study Group Annual Report 2014-2015

Meetings

The last RESG meeting took place at the 2014 BSA Annual Conference. The meeting was chaired by Nirmal Puwar, Kehinde Andrews and Aaron Winter collectively and minutes were taken by Kehinde Andrews. Business included:

- Minutes from last meeting new convenors, events, survey of group/field
- Agenda Items:
 - Review: Past Year and Annual Report
 - Membership: Discussed membership numbers
 - Conferences: Discussed RESG 'Mapping the Field' Conference and Book Proposal and the Race, Ethnicity and Migration Stream Proposal for future BSA Annual Conferences.
 - Budget: Discussed the budget, use of funds and income generation.
 - Wider Engagement
 - Communication. Discussed the use of email, social media and future meetings. Professor John Solomos proposed starting a Twitter account, which we did in May 2014.
 - Future Activities: Discussed RESG sponsoring and badging events, the next RESG conference and next BSA Annual Conference

Membership

Last year, the RESG had 111 members and 511 subscribers to the RESG JISC Mail list. That was an increase from 51 members as of April 2013. In 2014-2015, there were 108 members and 555 subscribers to the JISC Mail list. That is a decrease in 3 members and increase of 41 subscribers. It may be the case that some RESG members did not renew their BSA memberships, do not subscribe to JISC Mail or have unsubscribed for short or long periods. This will be looked into in order to ensure accurate numbers.

Communication/Forums

Aaron Winter and Kehinde Andrews manage the JISC Mail email list. In January 2015, we had the email list change name from BSA-RACE-ETHNICITY-FORUM to BSA-RACE-ETHNICITY, in order to avoid confusion with the newly re-activated Race Advisor Forum, as previously the Forum name was used interchangeably with Study Group. As stated above, in 2014-2015 we had an overall increase of 44 in subscribers from 511 to 555.

Winter and Andrews manage the RESG Facebook page with Dr Syd Jeffers (UEL) and Dr Karim Murji (OU) as managers of the RESG Facebook page (https://www.facebook.com/BsaRaceAndEthnicityStudyGroup?fref=ts). Followers of the Facebook page stood at 101 at the time of the April 2013 meeting. With increased promotion and postings, the followers have increased from 101 to 288 as of 20 February 2014 and to 411 as of 19 March 2015. We have also seen an increase in its use for sharing news items of interest to group members, discussions, promotion of conferences and events and CFPs.

As stated, Professor Solomos suggested starting a Twitter account at the 2014 meeting. In April 2014, we set up @bsarace and as of 19 March 2015, we have 394 followers. https://twitter.com/bsarace

Budget

Our current budget sits at: £1496.88

It was increased last year because of money made by the RESG conference 'Mapping the Field: Contemporary Theories of Race, Racism and Ethnicity' at Newman University on 31/01/2014. There were no income

generating activities in 02/2015-01/2015, and we supported two events with £200.00 funding each, which will be deducted from the current amount once we are invoiced:

- Julie Walsh (Warwick) from the BSA Psychoanalysis Study Group proposed working with RESG to run the event FrantzFanon: Concerning the Psychoanalysis and Cosmopolitanism of Violence to be held 18 March 2015 at Warwick. Support: Promotion.
- Remi Salisbury (Leeds) and others have started a critical race network and requested support for an inaugural event: *The White Rose Critical Race and Ethnicities Network (CREN) Annual Conference* to be held on Friday 19th June 2015. **Support: £200**

- After discussions with the BSA related to diversity issues, they reactivated the Race Forum renamed Race Advisory Forum and a place on BSA Council. Winter, Andrews and Puwar serve as co-convenors and Winter serves as representative for the first term. In that capacity, he attended the BSA Council's 5-year strategy meeting in 2014.
- The RESG and Race Advisory Forum were also given a role in nominating the 2015 BSA-British Library Equality Lecture speaker.

- RESG conveners are currently in discussion with members to sponsor and support events they are
 proposing and organising. RESULTS: SUCCESSFUL. BADGED ESRC CONFERNECE,
 RECEIVED TWO PROPOSALS AND FUNDED BOTH.
- RESG conveners have also issued a call to members to submit suggestions and proposals for future activities and events. **RESULTS: ONGOING**
- RESG convenors are also committed to organising a study group conference with support from group members in 2014/15. RESULTS: DECIDED TO DO IT EVERY TWO YEARS AND NOT ANNUALLY.
