Title: Are teenagers the canaries in the digital policy coalmine?

Bio: Huw has a PhD in Web Science and is currently a (digital) sociologist engaged in a range of research projects at the Oxford Internet Institute. His work addresses: digital and social inequalities; young peoples' digital skills and literacies; children's safety relative to the Internet of Things; Al's impact on education; and freelancers' ability to adapt to the shifting demands of the digital platform economy. Huw is also co-convenor of the BSA's digital sociology group.

Key statement for the day: To help develop effective policy, Huw will share insights from his research to show why it's dangerous for us to generalise about young people – particularly to underestimate and/or overestimate.
