

Sociology is seeking **6 new Editorial Board Members** to serve from January 2020 to December 2022.

About the Board

The *Sociology* Editorial Board is a working board, involved in reviewing submissions and also in the direction of the journal. Members review an average of 12 papers per year, depending on the articles being submitted to the journal. Board Members are required to review both in their areas of expertise and also as general reviewers across all areas of sociology. In addition to reviewing, there are regular opportunities for board members to volunteer to take part in various projects that contribute to the running of the journal.

The Editorial Board meets twice a year. The BSA will reimburse board members for all reasonable UK travel costs incurred as a direct result of their attendance at Board Meetings.

Criteria for Application

Prospective Editorial Board members must:

- be nominated by a current BSA member
- be a BSA member or join the BSA at time of nomination
- have experience of being published in refereed journals
- have refereed a minimum of five articles for peer-review journals
- not be members of the Work, Employment and Society Editorial Board
- be based at a UK institution

The Board invites applications involving any areas of methodological, theoretical and empirical expertise, though candidates with expertise in the following areas are particularly needed:

- Contemporary social and sociological theory
- Race and ethnicity
- Postcolonial theory
- STS
- Environment/climate change
- The body
- Sociology of work
- Economic sociology
- Cultural sociology

As well as reviewing in their own areas of expertise, board members may also be asked to review in a generalist capacity. Previous experience of reviewing is essential to the role for this reason.

Sociology welcomes members from any cultural or academic background to contribute to the diversity of research published by the journal.





The Board is not able to accept more than two Board Members from the same institution on the Board at any one time and currently we cannot accept any applications from anyone based at **the University of Kent**. We also cannot accept candidates from the same institution as the Editorial Team - **the University of Manchester**.
