

# BSA WES Conference 2023 Hardship Bursary Opportunities and Application

Are you a postgraduate or an early career researcher? Are you experiencing financial hardship? If so, you can apply for a funded place to attend the **WES Conference 2023** being held at Glasgow Caledonian University, 13-15 September 2023.

## About the Funded Conference Places

For 2023, WES is offering **60 funded places** for full conference registration. These places are available for postgraduates, early career researchers and delegates experiencing financial hardship.

In addition, WES is also offering **15 travel bursaries**. There are 10 bursaries of £250 and 5 bursaries of £1000, to offer greater levels of support to those in lower income countries. The bursaries of £250 are available to delegates in countries in Category A and the bursaries of £1000 are open to those in Category B countries. ## Eligibility Criteria

- You must have had an abstract accepted for presentation at the BSA WES Conference 2023 (You may apply at any time, but funding will be awarded to those who have been accepted.)
- You must not have access to funding for conference attendance.
- Preference will be given to those who have not had funding, including institutional funding, to attend other conferences in the last 12 months.

## Application Process

The email should include the following:

- Full name
- Institutional affiliation, if any
- Country from which you are applying
- Title of your Abstract
- The type of funding you are applying for (conference registration and/or travel bursary\*)
- A brief (250 words or less) paragraph explaining your reasons for applying for a bursary.

\*Please note that applicants can apply for both registration and one of the travel bursaries.

## Deadline

The closing date for applications will be one week after abstract decisions have been communicated.
