Membership

We have **785 JISC mail subscribers**, 75 BSA members and 710 non-members, and extensive activity through the listserv. This leads to substantive discussions and debates on issues of race, ethnicity and migration (in no small part facilitated by the introduction of the Race, Ethnicity and Migration Stream which has been running since 2015). Our study group presence has also increased through social media engagement via our Twitter and Facebook accounts, CFPs, event promotion and organisation, relevant news, publications, and activism including petitions.
