Aims:

The aims of the Study Group are:

- To build an inclusive, collegial and supportive community for sociologists at all career stages based in the UK who study elites.
- Planning Meeting with Members of the study group to discuss on potential ideas for events, congress, and other activities (February 2023).
- To run a mailing list and communication network to disseminate research ideas, project proposals, information about publications and other resources.
- To develop a programme of events, including member conferences, themed seminars and workshops.
- To provide a forum to stimulate debate and build collaborations in the UK and internationally.

2023-2024 Activities:

- Held a 'Research Clinic for research on Elites', a peer-support initiative co-organised with the Elite Studies Working Group, in November 2023.

- On May 13 and 14, will host the 'Transnational Elites: Imperial Histories, Global Power and Public Resistance Today' Conference funded by the British Academy.
