We are excited to invite you to the next BSA Theory event – celebrating contemporary Critical Theory that is furthering the legacy pioneered by Frankfurt School members such as Theodor Adorno and Max Horkheimer, and developing new perspectives on contemporary conjunctures, contradictions, crises, and opportunities for collective emancipation.

The event will explore the Frankfurt School's Political Economy and Critical Social Theory. In particular, we will consider early and contemporary critical theorists' contributions to the critique of political economy, discuss the proposals put forward in the Institute for Social Research's Perspectives for future research (published on the occasion of the IfS' centenary, in December 2023), and highlight recent scholarship that illustrates how the anti-fascist and abolitionist critique of incarceration has been developed in close dialogue with the work of the Frankfurt School.

In the words of the IfS Perspectives' authors,

With an eye on the opposing tendencies and practices of resistance to the ill functioning, Critical Theory today re asserts: Things need not be so, people can change them, the conditions to do so are at hand. And yet, by the same token, the conditions are equally in place for the regressive, authoritarian, violent perpetuation of the current state of affairs, as well as for the emergence of new forms of regression, authoritarianism, and violence.

We hope that this event will provide the opportunity for good conversations and collective thinking around critiquing, resisting, and mobilising beyond processes of oppression and exploitation in their current and future forms.
