

## Full-time (Tenured) Position in Comparative Sociology, Senshu University

Assigned courses: Qualitative research methods, comparative sociology, BA thesis seminars for junior and senior students, and other related courses including research method practicum, readings in sociology, introduction to sociology. Ability to teach graduate-level courses is a plus. If the successful candidate has little teaching experience, she or he will teach undergraduate courses during first few years and will be invited to teach graduate courses after a satisfactory performance review.

Title and position: Professor, Associate Professor or Lecturer (Full-time)  
(Title/position to be determined based on candidate's experience and achievements.)

Starting date: April 1, 2020

Qualifications: 1) Successful candidates will have a Ph.D. (in hand or by April 1, 2020) in sociology or related inter- or transdisciplinary field.  
2) Preferred specialties include comparative sociology with strong training in mixed methods, analytical sociology, and/or computational social science.  
3) This position is open to scholars of all nationalities. Successful candidates must be able to conduct classes and supervise research and writing in both Japanese and English.  
4) Candidates with conference presentations and/or publications in languages other than Japanese will be given preference.

Application deadline: All materials must be received by no later than July 1, 2019.

Application entry: All applicants must register on the Senshu University website: <https://www.senshu-u.ac.jp/about/recruitment/teacher.html>. Upon registration, applicants will be sent a receipt number via email from the university. The receipt number should be printed on the list of academic publications.

Application materials: 1) Senshu University Job Application Form (must be completed in Japanese)  
2) Curriculum Vitae or a supplementary document to 1) Senshu University Job Application Form, which includes:  
(a) Extramural funding  
(b) Information on pertinent job certificates in addition to academic degrees, if any  
(c) Professional service activities  
(d) Names, affiliations, and contact information for three potential references  
The CV or supplementary document can be in either Japanese or English.  
3) Full text of the two publications that were summarized in the Job Application Form (Off prints or photocopies accepted)  
4) Statement of research plans (2000 characters in Japanese)  
5) Certificate of the highest degree obtained (photocopy of diploma accepted)

Note: In addition, email a pdf file of application materials to [opencall\\_sociology@isc.senshu-u.ac.jp](mailto:opencall_sociology@isc.senshu-u.ac.jp). You do not have to include any materials that are difficult to digitize such as books not available in electronic format. The pdf file size must be less than 10 megabytes.

Selection process: After preliminary screening based on the submitted materials, shortlisted candidates will be invited for an interview and teaching demonstration.
